
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Where are the opportunities and risks in asset allocation?

Asset allocation decisions can be based on many factors, including the recent and expected performance of assets.

Based on our analysis, assets like high yield or investment grade may see stronger returns relative to their recent history, but for U.S. large-cap equity, the next five years while positive — may be more challenging.
