

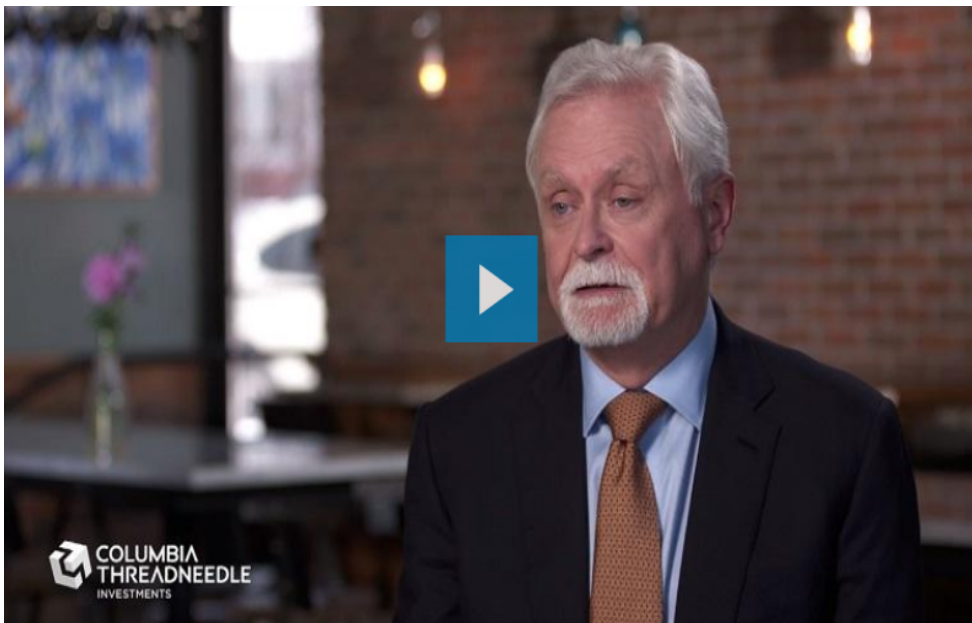


Free trade needs fair competition
